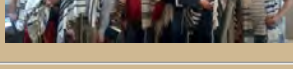

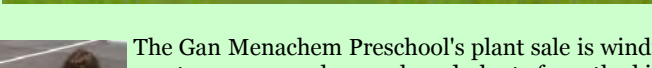

The Gan Menachem Preschool's plant sale is winding down. Thank you to everyone who purchased plants from the kids, and making the fundraiser a big success. We hope you in turn have success with your gardens this year! Now that the sale is over we are moving into phase two: establishing our own gardens here at the Chabad Center. The Gan Menachem Garden is well under way. Much thanks to Larry Gilbert for designing and putting so much time and muscle into the construction of our fence! Without a fence, a garden is just a deer restaurant. The preschoolers are employing "companion planting" in their gardens. Certain varieties of herbs, flowers, and plants not only make vegetables taste better, but also drive away pests. For instance, radishes and oregano drive away the dreaded cucumber beetle! Tomatoes, cucumbers, Alaska Peas, carrots, Tom Thumb Lettuce, basil, marigolds, sunflowers, petunias and radishes have already been planted. Only our peppers are waiting for their turn. They are going in this week.

Larry, Gan Menachem's Zohar Asbel, and Ian Braslawski also completed construction of the fence for the larger Friendship Garden plot this past week. Wasting no time, the little gardeners of Gan Menachem set to work preparing the beds for planting. Brandywine and Golden Jubilees are already planted, along with a variety of cherry tomatoes, basil, and Rosemary. Among the many varieties of tomatoes that are going in will be hot peppers, herbs, and seeded crops like beans and peas, and a number of other surprises. 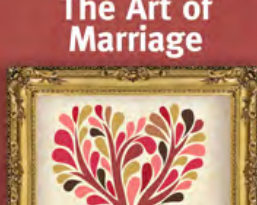

Please join us for "A Journey into the Soul of Torah", a weekly Torah study.

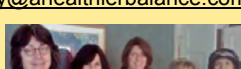
The class will continue on Thursdays at 7:30 pm at The Lori Schottenstein Chabad Center. Open to all and free of charge.
