#### Lighting up Columbus, Guilt Free

People often ask why Chabad spend so much time on public menorah lightings. (A list of our menorah lightings are below.) Why do we emphasize bringing light to a public arena?

Yesterday, was the 19th day of the Hebrew month of Kislev. This day is celebrated as the "Rosh Hashanah of Chassidism." It was on this date, in the year 1798, that the founder of Chabad Chassidism, Rabbi Schneur Zalman of Lladi (1745-1812), was freed from his imprisonment in Czarist Russia. More than a personal liberation, this was a watershed event in the history of Chassidism, heralding a new era in the revelation of the "inner soul" of Torah.

The public dissemination of the teachings of Chassidism had in fact begun two generations earlier. The founder of the Chassidic movement, Rabbi Israel Baal Shem Tov (1698-1760), revealed to his disciples gleanings from the mystical soul of Torah which had previously been the sole province of select kabbalists in each generation. This work was continued by the Baal Shem Tov's disciple, Rabbi DovBer, the 'Maggid of Mezeritch,' who is also deeply connected with the date of 18 Kislev: on this day in 1772, 26 years before Rabbi Schneur Zalmar's release from prison, the Maggid returned his soul to his Maker Before his passing, he said to his disciple, Rabbi Schneur Zalman: "This day is our yom tov (festival)."

Rabbi Schneur Zalman went much farther than his predecessors, bringing these teachings to broade segments of the Jewish population of Eastern Europe. More significantly, Rabbi Schneur Zalman founded the "Chabad" approach a philosophy and system of study, meditation, and character refinement that made these abstract concepts rationally comprehensible and practically applicable in ily li

In its formative years, the Chassidic movement was the object of strong, and often venomous, opposition from establishment rabbis and laymen. Even within the Chassidic community, a number of Rabbi Schneur Zalmar's contemporaries and colleagues fitt that he had "gone too far" in making tangible and popularizing the hitherto hidden soul of Torah.

In the fail of 1799, Rabbi Schneur Zalman was arrested on charges that his teachings and activities threatened the imperial authority of the Czar, and was imprisoned in an island fortress in the Neva River in Petersburg. In his interrogradinos, he was compelled to present to the Czar's ministers the basic tenets of Judaism and explain various points of Chassidic philosophy and practice. After 53 days, **he was econerated of all charges and released**.

Rabbi Schneur Zalman saw these events as a reflection of what was transpiring Above. He regarded his arrest as but the earthly echo of a Heavenly indictment against his revelation of the most intimate secrets of the Torah. And he saw his release as signifying his vindication in the Heavenly court. Following his liberation on 19 Kislev, he redoubled his efforts, disseminating his teachings on a far broader scale, and with more detailed and "down-to-earth" explanations, than before.

The Rebbe wanted us to continue bringing light to as many "forgotten" places in the world. When Jews feel all alone and isolated, our public memorah lightings remind them that wherever they may be found, they can light up their environment with much positive light, love and hope.



#### Parshat Vayeishev

Jacob settes in Hebron with his twelve sons. His favorite is seventeen-year-old Joseph, whose brothers are jealous of the preferential treatment he receives from his father, such as a precious <u>many-colored coat</u> that Jacob makes for Joseph. Joseph relates to his brothers two of his <u>dreams</u>, which fortell that he is destined to rule over them, increasing their envy and hatred towards him.

Simeon and Levi plot to kill him, but Reuben suggests that they throw him into a pit instead, intending to come back later and save him. While Joseph is in the pit, Judah has him sold to a band of passing <u>Ishmaelites</u>. The brothers dip Joseph's special coat in the blood of a goat and show it to their father, leading him to believe that his most beloved son was devoured by a wild beast.

beast. Judah marries and has three children. The eldest, Er, dies young and childless, and his wife. <u>Tamar</u>, is given in levirate marriage to the second son, <u>Onan</u>, Onan sins by spilling his seed, and he too meets an early death. Judah is reluctant to have his third son marry her. Determined to have a child from Judah's family. Tamar disguises herself as a prostitute and seduces Judah himself. Judah hears that his daughter-in-law has become pregnant and orders her executed for hardory, but when <u>Tamar</u> produces some personal effects he left with her as a pledge for payment, he publicly admits that he is the father. Tamar gives birth to twin sons. <u>Peretr</u> (an ancestor of King David) and <u>Zerach</u>.

Joseph is taken to Kang bench and <u>service</u>, minister in charge of <u>Pharaoh</u>'s slaughterhouses. G-d biesses everything he does, and soon he is made overseer of all his master's property. <u>Poliphar's wife</u> desires the handsome and charismatic laid, when Joseph rejects her advances, she tells her husband that the Hebrew save tried to force himself on her, and has him thrown into <u>prison</u>. Joseph gains the trust and admiration of this jailers, who appoint him to a position of authority in the prison administration.

In prison, Joseph meets Pharach's <u>chief butter</u> and <u>chief baker</u>, both incarcerated for offending their royal master. Both have disturbing <u>dreams</u>, which Joseph Interprets; in three days, he tells them, the butter will be released and the baker hanged. Joseph asks the butter to intercede on his behalf with Pharach. Joseph's predictions are fulfilled, but the butter <u>forgets</u> all about Joseph and does nothing for him.
